

Whiz Away in Ski-keyed Quiltings

Ready, steady, ski! It's a breeze if you know the slopes and the ropes. Dressing for the trails is good sport too, when your wrap-ups are drift-deep quiltings that leg it right down over the boot!

Frosty-blue snow job, left, makes the perfect foil for muffin-toasty you. Under the zippy band-collar jacket is (would you believe) a ski jumpsuit. It buttons at the shoulders and schusses past hip pockets to long, straight legs! By Sportcaster; each part about \$30. Alpenblick cap and pouch.

Apricot makes a splash, top right, and lands high on your ski list. For openers, a zip-front jacket, collar snapped and banded, side pockets closed so nothing spills if you do (about \$35). Next, a hug of a vest, buttoned in front, belted in back, quilt-cozy all around (about \$16). Warm-up pants race to the finish line (about \$25). By White Stag.

Skiing in the pink, below right, gives any buff a lift, especially when honeycomb quilting is side-stepped with streaks of sleek nylon. Long-run jacket has a snappy mandarin collar; sleeves are roomy and raglan (about \$46). Warm-ups zip this way and that to give legs the easy life (about \$30). Suit by Aspen. Everitt cap and scarf.
