

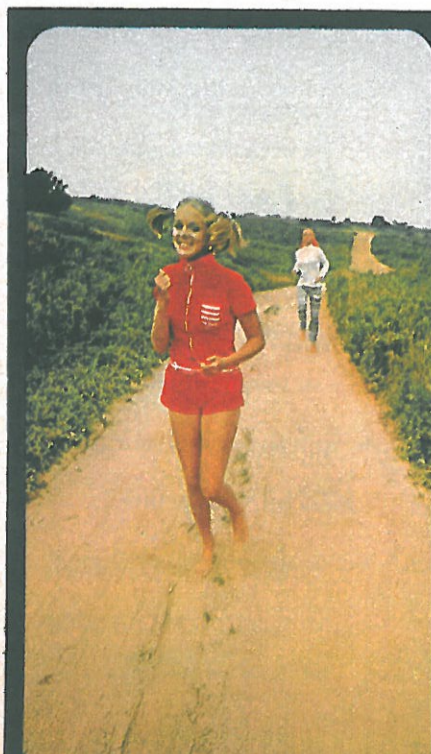
# Purely pastel

You're the girl with a delicate air, the one most likely to "keep it light" in all your summer sun-play. Mere tints are your make-up, soft streaks illumine your hair. But even though your skin is fair game for freckles, staying out of the sun is out! What's in is to Pamper—whether you're gathering daisies or beautiful thoughts, biking in a breeze or jogging easy-does-it. To prevent tanning or burning and really foil freckles, wear an invisible film of sunblock cream every minute of every hour you spend outdoors. It's the pretty way to stay fair. The newest versions of sunblock creams are water-repellent, so protection lasts throughout the day even if you catch some poolside splash. They are not waterproof, however—a fact to remember when you decide to go in for a swim yourself. Reapply the sunblock after each dip. Keep lips guarded too with generous strokes of protective gloss.

**Cultivate** the flowery look that becomes you. Use a foundation with a built-in sunscreen (another bonus barrier between you and a burn) to smooth out uneven skin tones. Match the color as closely as possible to your own complexion so that your fresh-bud look doesn't end at the chinline. For day (just a subtle touch, please) or evening, choose the softest pastels in eye and lip colors, with liner and mascara in the light-through-charcoal-brown range.

**Highlight** your hair, especially if it's brown on the shady side. Turn on sunshine with a streaking kit—and bask in the glow of golden light rays framing your face. Follow package directions, do a strand test and then (when you've passed) place the streaks around your hairline. As summer drifts by, you may want to add a few more. Stay close to the hairline and select new strands each time for a radiant blend. Keep it that way too—by protecting your hair from strong sunlight.
